To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 3, 1855, entitled an "An Act in addition to certain Acts granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the military service of the United States," there has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE,

Warrant No. *35,953* for *120* acres, in favor of *Jonathan A. Carlton*, a Corporal in Captain Smart's Company of Marine Militia, *for Eastern frontier disturbances.*

with evidence that the same has been duly located upon *the South half of the South East quarter and the South West quarter of the South West quarter of Section twenty, in Township twenty-five North of Range One West, in the District of Lands subject to sale at La Crosse, Wisconsin, containing one hundred and twenty acres;*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** by the SURVEYOR GENERAL *the said warrant having been assigned by the said Jonathan A. Carlton to Lincoln Clark, in whose favor said tract have been located*

NOW KNOW YE, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *Lincoln Clark, as assignee as aforesaid and to his heirs and assigns*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Lincoln Clark, as assignee as aforesaid and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
